

<u>AN END TO TEASING</u>—Help your child take the sting out of being teased. Roleplay different ways your kids can react. They could ignore the comments, walk away, or make a joke. Example: "Of course, I have big ears. All the better to hear you with, my dear".

<u>COMMUNICATION</u>- Children are more likely to cooperate if you make requests rather than demands. Example: Instead of "Set the table", try "I need your help setting the table". Instead of "Do your homework" try "It's time to do your homework. Please get started."
